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
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# Welcome!



## DAY ONE - *Introduction*

### Start Here

#### PRAY: FROM YOUR HEART

When someone says **“Come,”** it’s usually an invitation to a person or a place. For example,

- ***Come to my house***
- ***Come here***
- ***Come home***
- ***Come to church with me***

We know that invitations are extended for many wonderful reasons. It could be an invitation to an intimate event, such as a dinner or wedding. It could be an invitation to participate in a conversation or a confession. Or it could be an invitation to something totally new and unfamiliar.

People’s invitations may not always be in our best interests. But when God extends an invitation, it’s **ALWAYS** for our benefit and advantage. God invites us to come so that:

- We can get to know Him with our hearts, not just our heads
  - We can learn to recognize His voice and understand His ways
  - He can reveal the marvelous things He’s planned for us
  - We can be transformed by the renewing of our minds
  - We will receive power to live as His disciples and His heart and hands on earth

Outwardly, you seem just fine. You have friends, a stable family, plenty to eat and drink. In fact, your fridge is stocked with enough food and beverages to feed a tribe. You have the freedom to do what you want with your body, and perhaps you make the most of it. Yet your soul could be crying out for more!

That cry is an SOS for a divine connection with the Lord, real love, true freedom, and a purpose-driven life that makes a difference. No earthly pleasure or delicacy can quench a soul that is dangerously dehydrated.

Jesus knew people would grow tired. In this passage, He offers a powerful, compassionate solution to a persistent problem—His rest and renewal in exchange for our weariness, His strength in exchange for our weakness. We can't lose with an arrangement like that!





What a pivotal, life-changing moment. I'm sure that event went down as one of the best of their lives!
